Record of Deportable/Excludable Alien:

ENCOUNTER:

The subject came to the attention of the Hartford-DRO CAP unit as the result of an audit of the State of Connecticut probation client list. This subject was identified to be potentially removable via records checks.

ARREST ENCOUNTER:

On June 20, 2013, the Fugitive Operations Unit encountered and arrested Clayton GORDON without incident at approximately 9:30a.m. after conducting a vehicle stop on Ledyard Ave in Bloomfield, Connecticut. At 0900hrs Deportation Officer Stephen Riccardi, Immigration Agents Derek Moore and IEA Darren Gelermino observed GORDON as he walked from his residence of 29 Ledyard Ave and get into a red Ford Explorer parked in the driveway. The vehicle proceeded down Ledyard Ave passing directly in front of Deportation Officer Riccardi and a positive identification was made from a photograph in the workfolder. Deportation Officer Riccardi activated the emergency equipment on the service vehicle and GORDON came to a stop. DO Riccardi, IEA's Moore and Gelermino approached the vehicle where DO Riccardi verbally identified himself to GORDON. GORDON complied to the request to exit the vehicle and was taken into custody. The vehicle was secured and GORDON was transported to the ICE Sub-Office in Hartford, Connecticut for processing. GORDON was transported by IEA Darren Gelermino without incident.

ALIENAGE:

The subject is a native and citizen of Jamaica who record checks show is a Lawful Permanent Resident of the United States. There are no applications on file to show that the subject ever applied to naturalize and become a citizen of the United States.

DERIVATIVE CITIZENSHIP DATA:

Both of the subject's parents are natives of Jamaica. Both of the subject's parents, Derrick GORDON ([REDACTED]) and Carleen GORDON ([REDACTED]), appear to be Lawful Permanent Residents of the United States, with neither appearing to have any record of naturalization to become United States citizens.

The subject's parents do appear to have been married on December 3, 1977 (prior to the subject's birth), though only the subject's mother is listed on the subject's Jamaican birth certificate. There is no evidence that the subject's parents divorced on file.
