CONSENT ORDER

This matter has come before the Court on the plaintiffs' complaint and application for a preliminary injunction. The parties to this action, wishing to resolve it amicably, agree as follows, and the Court hereby ORDERS, as follows:

- 1. The Defendants, the City of Cambridge and the City Manager Louis DePasquale (the "City") will, no later than 10 business days after this Consent Order has been executed on behalf of all parties and approved by the Court:
 - (a) issue a public statement, that the City does not charge for public safety services for non-commercial expressive events in the City's parks;
 - (b) to the extent that the City maintains information about the permitting processes for events in City parks on its websites, such postings shall

(c) remove from all relevant websites any statements indicating that the

City may or might charge for public safety services for non-commercial

include a statement that the City does not charge for public safety

expressive events in the City's parks; and

- (d) confirm to Plaintiffs' counsel that the City has waived any charges to Plaintiffs for public safety services provided or contracted for by the City for the Women's March on January 20, 2018 on the Cambridge Common.
- 2. Within 10 business days of the steps agreed to by the parties in the preceding paragraph having in fact been taken and Plaintiffs' counsel having received written notice from the Defendants that the required steps have been taken, Plaintiffs will file a Notice of Voluntary Dismissal of the case, pursuant to Mass. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(i).
 - 3. Each party will bear its own attorneys' fees and costs.
