## ORDER

This matter came before the court on the petitioners' motion for a status conference. It is hereby ORDERED the motion for a status conference is DENIED. In that motion, the petitioners requested that the court schedule a hearing so that the parties could discuss methods to track the progress of the Commonwealth's Phase 1 vaccination program for individuals living in congregate facilities. The matter was referred to this Single Justice for disposition. Thereafter, I issued an order requiring respondents to file a response indicating whether they opposed vaccination reporting requirements, and if not, what information should be added to the Special Master's weekly report.

Based upon the requests of the parties, and cognizant of the need to "effectuate the purposes of this decision and the underlying public health goals," <a href="Committee for Pub. Counsel">Counsel</a>
<a href="Servs.">Servs.</a> v. Chief Justice of the Trial Court, 484 Mass. 431, 456</a>
and Appendix B (2020), I amend the reporting requirement by

adding a Weekly Vaccination Report. The county sheriffs and the

Department of Correction shall report:

the total population of incarcerated individuals;

• the weekly number of first vaccination doses administered

to incarcerated individuals and all staff;

the total number of first vaccination doses administered to

incarcerated individuals and all staff;

the weekly number of second vaccination doses administered

to incarcerated individuals and all staff;

the total number of second vaccination doses administered

to incarcerated individuals and all staff;

the weekly number of incarcerated individuals and staff who

have refused the offered vaccine; and

the total number of incarcerated individuals and staff who

have refused the offered vaccine.
