I. PURPOSE

This plan is the intended framework for the Boston Police Department's (Department) for the Major League Baseball World Series Championship Game 6 between the Boston Red Sox and the St. Louis Cardinals.

This plan is Law Enforcement Sensitive and shall not be distributed outside the Department without the expressed permission of the Police Commissioner.

II. SITUATION

The Boston Red Sox will play the St. Louis Cardinals for the Major League Baseball World Series Championship. The first pitch is at 8:07 PM and the game is expected to conclude about 11:45 PM. The Red Sox lead the series 3-1 and if they win tonight's game they will win the World Series. It is expected that if the Red Sox win, there will be large, spontaneous celebrations throughout the City. The vast majority of these celebrations will be joyous events for fans but also it is almost certainly expected to attract over-exuberant fans and individuals wishing to take advantage of the celebration to engage in acts of vandalism and reckless behavior that endangers themselves and others.

The Department will protect the rights of Red Sox fans who wish to peacefully celebrate the victory. The Department and our Law Enforcement partners will ensure that fans are able to celebrate but will not tolerate disorder, property destruction, reckless behavior that endangers the actor or other individuals.

Due to the magnitude of the event, the Boston Police Department will be assisted by several state and regional agencies that will be playing a supporting role with the BPD acting as the led agency.

III. MISSION

The Mission of the Boston Police Department is to meet our responsibility in providing the most efficient and effective use of the police resources in protecting the lives and property of residents, visitors, and business owners in the City. The goal of this Mission is to prevent crime, maintain order, and provide public safety services to the City's neighborhoods.

In furtherance of this Mission, the Department will facilitate the cooperation, and coordinate the public safety activities of our regional Public Safety/Law Enforcement partners to provide a level of public safety services that ensures the safety for all individuals wishing to peacefully celebrate the Red Sox Win.

The Department's primary objectives are:

- Protect Lives
- Maintain Order
- Preserve the Peace
- Protect Property
- Arrest Law Violators

Personnel awareness points:

- All personnel are to be vigilant for any security issues.
 - Be professional and courteous to the public. "Treat people the way you want to be treated."
 - Zero tolerance for public drinking. Officers shall stop, cite, seize all alcohol, and if necessary, arrest the offender.

IV. <u>CONCEPT OF OPERATION</u>

A. Unified Command Center

Unified Command Center

The Department will manage this special multi-agency event utilizing the Incident Command System (ICS). Use of ICS will allow the different agencies and disciplines to coordinate their activities through the use of common terminology, common goals and objectives, and unity of command.

A Unified Command structure will be utilized with Superintendent William B. Evans serving as the Incident Commander. The Operations Section Chief, Deputy Superintendent Bernard O'Rourke, is responsible for all operational missions, administrative tasks and management of all personnel assigned to the event within the designated Zones. The Operations Section Chief reports directly to the Incident Commander.

The Incident Commanders intent is to (1) confine the celebrations in the smallest possible area within the boundaries of street closures in the area of Fenway Park/Kenmore Sq, Hemenway St., Faneuil Hall, Harvard Ave. and Brighton Ave., (2) maintain public order, (3) maintain traffic control, (4) prevent violations of the law. The Incident Commander's intent will be manifested by a very visible presence of uniformed personnel in soft uniform. Units will be assigned to walk through the crowds encouraging people to celebrate in a congratulatory but non-destructive manner. A very visible presence will be maintained along the perimeter of event areas. POP platoons will stage in close proximity to their assigned operational areas.

The Unified Command structure will achieve the following:

- Support and coordinate multi-agency planning;
- Unity of Command with one Unified Commander, with Deputies from involved agencies and disciplines, who will implement the plan;
- □ Allow agencies with public safety responsibilities to be part of the Unified Command.

The Unified Command Center (UCC) will be located in the Boston Police Command Center, 1 Schroeder Plaza. The UCC shall integrate and coordinate all public safety agencies and assets dedicated to the event.

The UCC shall be organized around five functions or sections:

- Command: Incident Command
- Operations: Manages all events/incident tactical operations and implementation of Incident Action Plans (IAP). The UCC has direct responsibility for operational planning and implementation of plans.
- Planning and Intelligence: responsibility for the collection, analysis, and dissemination of tactical information and intelligence pertaining to the event.

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Logistics: Support the needs of the event, including ordering resources. The logistics section provides facilities, transportation, supplies, and equipment.

B. Tactical Operations Center

The Tactical Operations Center (TOC) will be located at Boston Police Headquarters (One Schroeder Plaza). The TOC is responsible for the management and deployment of all tactical resources, including monitoring readiness status, situation reporting, planning of tactical operations, and reporting functions. The Special Management Group shall be located within the TOC. The SMG will coordinate the deployment of all specialized units. The SMG will contain the following specialized units:

- Public Order Platoons
- Mobile Field Forces
- SWAT
- EOD
- HAZMAT
- □ K-9 Units
- Field Intelligence Units

The Boston Regional Intelligence Center (BRIC) will be located within the TOC. The BRIC shall coordinate the collection of all intelligence data coming to the TOC, analyze the data, and disseminate the intelligence product to the UCC and Zone Commanders.

A Boston Police Commander will be assigned as a liaison to all outside agencies POP.

The TOC structure will ensure chain of command, command responsibility, and the safety and welfare of both the general public and public safety personnel.

Superintendent Paul Fitzgerald shall command the Special Management Group.

C. Field Command

To facilitate the delivery of public safety services the City has been subdivided into operational zones. Each zone will have its own command structure and commander. Quick Response Squads (QRS) will be assigned to each zone commander and are under his command for deployment. QRS are to remain highly visible and alert to potential problems within their respective zones.

Zone Commanders are responsible for all operational missions and administrative tasks within the contiguous areas of their designated Zone. Zone Commanders are under the command of the Operations Section Chief and the Incident Commander. Each Zone has a pre-designated number of officers necessary to accomplish its mission:

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Protection of lives Order Maintenance Crowd and Traffic Control

- □ Protection of property
 □ Arrest of violators

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ZONE 1: Fenway Park.

Specific Instructions:

The Primary area of concern is inside and immediately around Fenway Park, the Yawkey Way/ Van Ness St. area. Units from Area D will be assigned to Fenway Park. Officers will deny access from any person attempting to enter the streets around the Park.

ZONE 2: Kenmore Square Area.

Specific Instructions:

The Primary area of concern is Commonwealth Ave., Beacon St. Brookline Ave. intersection. POP 2 (DCU) and units from Area D will be assigned to Kenmore Square. Steel barriers will be utilized to keep the crowds separated at Brookline Ave. & Newbury St. extension. Officers will deny access from any vehicle or pedestrian from proceeding on Brookline Avenue toward Lansdowne Street. POP 2 will stage at 602 Commonwealth Avenue.

ZONE 3: Brookline Ave., from Yawkey Way to Park Drive

Specific Instructions:

The primary areas of concern are the intersections of Brookline @ Yawkey Way, to include the area in front of the Boston Beer Works, toward Park Drive. POP 5 (NEMLEC) and Units from Area C will be assigned to Brookline Ave. Steel barriers will be utilized to keep the crowds separated at Brookline Ave. & Kilmarnock Street. Officers will deny access from any vehicle or pedestrian from proceeding on Brookline Avenue toward Yawkey Way. All vehicles exiting parking lots will be directed toward Park Drive. The Brookline Ave. lot will be closed at the gate onto Brookline Ave. and all vehicles will be directed toward Beacon St. and then further toward Park Drive. POP 5 will stage in the Landmark Center on Brookline Avenue.

ZONE 4: Brookline Ave. from Yawkey Way to Newbury St. Extension

Specific Instructions:

The primary areas of concern are the intersections of Lansdowne St. and Brookline Ave., and the Bridge area. POP 1 (YVSF/BSP) and Units from Area C will be assigned to Brookline Ave. Steel barriers will be utilized to keep the crowds separated at Brookline Ave. & Newbury Street Extension. POP 1 will stage in the Fenway School on Ipswich Street.

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ZONE 5: Lansdowne St. from Brookline Ave. to Ipswich St., Ipswich St. to Van Ness St. and to Boylston St. (both ends)

Specific instructions:

The Primary area of concern is Lansdowne St. and pedestrians exiting from the licensed premises. POP 5 (NEMLEC) and Units from Area B will be assigned to Lansdowne St./Ipswich St. area. Steel barriers will be utilized to keep the crowds separated at Lansdowne St. and Ipswich St, and from the exit doors of the last premises. Steel Barriers will block off pedestrian access at Ipswich and Charles Gate East, officers will deny access from any vehicle or pedestrian from proceeding on Ipswich St. toward Lansdowne St., all pedestrians will be directed toward Boylston St. & Hemenway Street.

ZONE 6: Boylston St. and the West Fens.

Special Instructions:

The Primary area of concern is along Boylston St. between Park Drive and Ipswich St. for crowds gathering. Massachusetts State Police units and POP 6 (MSP), with units from Area D and Area B will be assigned to the Boylston St. area and maintain high visibility. POP 6 will stage at Emerson College.

ZONE 7: Hemenway St. and East Fens area.

Specific Instructions:

The Primary area of concern is the Hemenway St., Gainsboro St., Westland Ave area. POP 4 (METROSLEC) and units from Area E will be assigned to the Hemenway St. area and will maintain high visibility.

ZONE 8: Faneuil Hall and North Station area.

Specific Instructions:

The Primary areas of concern are the Faneuil Hall and North Station areas and the patrons exiting the licensed premises. Units from Area A will be assigned to the Faneuil Hall and North Station area and will maintain high visibility.

ZONE 9: Brighton Ave. & Harvard Ave.

Specific Instructions:

The Primary areas of concern are the Brighton Ave. & Harvard Avenue. Units from Area D will be assigned to the Brighton Ave., Harvard Ave. and Cleveland Circle areas where they will maintain high visibility.

ZONE 10: Mission Hill/Calumet St. and Park Dr./Brookline Ave.

Specific Instructions:

The Primary areas of concern are the Mission Hill/Calumet St. and Park Dr./Brookline Ave. Areas. Units from Area B will be assigned to the areas.

ZONE 11: South Boston

Specific Instructions:

The Primary areas of concern are the: East Broadway, West Broadway, Old Colony Areas. Units from Area C will be assigned to the areas.

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D. Rules of Engagement (ROE)

The Primary Response to any calls for service in the neighborhoods will be the standard 911 response, with District units responding. If a larger presence is required the District Patrol Supervisor will make the request through operations.

The Department's response to issues of disorder must be proactive, immediate, interdictive, but not disproportional to the disorder.

The Decision to Declare an Unlawful Assembly

The decision to declare an Unlawful Assembly must be based on specific and compelling need for the safety of the public. The Boston Police Department recognizes the right of free speech and assembly but will actively protect people in the exercise of this right. A declaration of an Unlawful Assembly is a curtailment of First Amendment rights and should be resorted to only when there are no other reasonable alternatives.

Once a decision is made that an assembly is unlawful, an announcement must be made to the crowd by the senior law enforcement officer on scene that the crowd must disperse. The dispersal order must be read verbatim:

I am (state your name and rank) of the Boston Police Department. You are unlawfully assembled. I command you in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to immediately and peacefully disperse. If you do not immediately and peacefully disperse, you will be arrested.

If you remain in the area, regardless of your purpose in remaining, you will be in violation of Chapter 269 section 1 and you will be arrested. If you remain, reasonable and necessary force may be used to disperse the unlawful assembly. The following are routes of dispersal to peacefully leave the area: (describe the route you want the crown to take to leave the area). You have ____ minutes (provide a reasonable time for the crowd to leave taking into account the number of participants, location, and the number of routes) to disperse.

The dispersal order should be repeated at least three times and the crowd provided a reasonable amount of time to disperse.

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D. Rules of Engagement (ROE) Continued

The Operations Section Chief and/or the Zone Commander or BPD POP Liaison Commander on scene may deploy and engage law violators with OC Spray and hand launched Less Lethal Weapons Systems. If a more aggressive posture is required, only trained and qualified personnel shall handle CS Gas. Only the Police Commissioner or his designee (Incident Commander) can authorize the deployment of CS gas. Said authorization must be in writing. Once deployment is authorized the Operations Section Chief and/or the Zone Commander or BPD POP Liaison Commander may engage law violators at his discretion. Nothing shall prohibit the Operations Section Chief, on his own authority, from utilizing CS gas in order to protect the safety of his officers or citizens from serious or life threatening attack.

If dispersal of any crowd becomes necessary only the Incident Commander or Operations Section Chief shall give such an order. The following procedures shall be followed:

- 1. A warning will be given to the crowd to disburse
- 2. A sufficient time shall be allowed for the crowd to disperse
- 3. If the crowd refuses to disperse and/or is unruly the crowd will be dispersed
 - Kenmore Square- crowd be directed out of the square outbound on Beacon Street and outbound on Commonwealth Avenue
 - Boylston St.- crowd to be directed toward to Park Drive
 - Brookline Ave.- crowd to be directed to Park Drive
 - Lansdowne St.- crowd to be directed to Ipswich St. and then to Boylston St., West Fens

In dispersing an unruly crowd that is actually endangering public safety and security, the following graduations of force shall be considered:

- 1. Show of force
- 2. Crowd control formations
- 3. OC spray
- 4. Mechanical force

With authority of the Incident Commander only:

5. CS Gas

Use of force reports shall be reported pursuant to Rules 303, 303A, and 304.

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D. Rules of Engagement (ROE) (continued)

Authorization to utilize Oleoresin Capsicum Spray (OC) and mechanical force is vested in the Operations Section Chief and/or Zone Commander or BPD POP Liaison Commander or when under immediate threat, the supervisor on scene. Before utilizing any Less Lethal Force option, tactical consideration should be given to the following:

- A warning to the protesters if practicable,
- Wind direction or other obstructions to the effectiveness of the system utilized,
- Officer Safety,
- Notification to impacted personnel,
- The potential non-effectiveness of the systems utilized,
- Impact on the surrounding area and people present.

All law enforcement agencies participating in the Boston Red Sox Playoffs operation will comply with the Rules of Engagement drafted for this event. The ROE will be adhered to however nothing in the ROE prohibits the right of self-defense by an officer.

E. Field Intelligence Teams

The Boston Regional Intelligence Center will deploy Field Intelligence Teams that will report to the Intelligence Communications Center located in the TOC. The I-Teams will monitor individual and crowd behavior, identify individuals in the crowd to arrest teams for apprehension, and be alert for any unusual or suspicious activity. I-Teams will report through the ICC to the Incident Commander.

Foul Ball will be the password for I-Team recognition.

Rapid Assessment Teams (RAT)

The Boston Police Department, Boston Fire Department and Boston Emergency Medical Services will staff Rapid Assessment Teams to respond to, evaluate, and mitigate any reported incident of HAZMAT exposure.

H. Reporting

After Action Reports and decision logs will be maintained by all Zone Commanders and above. All after action reports will be forwarded to the Chief, Bureau of Field Services, via e-mail.

GENERAL INFORMATION & INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. The Boston Red Sox and St. Louis Cardinals will play for the World Series Championship.
- 2. ON THE FIRST HALF TOUR, **ALL SWORN PERSONNEL CITYWIDE** WILL BE IN THE UNIFORM OF THE DAY, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THOSE OFFICERS DESIGNATED BY THE CHIEF, BUREAU OF FIELD SERVICES.
- 3. The Operation Duty Supervisor will make sure that **NO ANTI CRIME UNITS** are fielded on the first half tour of duty.
- 4. ALL Officers assigned to the World Series events will have their issued Personnel Protective Equipment readily available at all times.
- 5. Officers assigned to Hemenway/Fenway/Kenmore Square area, (Zones 1 thru 7) will report to **Roll Call** at the Northeastern University Columbus Park Lot, located at 785 Columbus Ave., where they will park their personal vehicles inside the parking garage. No personal or department vehicles will be parked on the street or other NU property. Officers will be transported from this location to Fenway/Kenmore area. No officers' personal vehicles will be allowed in the vicinity of Fenway Park/Kenmore Square/Hemenway Street areas.
- 6. In the event of Emergency Deployment Team call-out, officers will report to Boston Latin School located on Avenue Louis Pasteur.
- 7. Special Operations SWAT will load their equipment truck and designate officers to perform a tactical response if the need arises.
- 8. Boston Transportation Department will assign tow trucks to the East and West Fens, Kenmore Square, North Station and the Faneuil Hall areas for parking enforcement.
- 9. Communications OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO Zones 1,2,3,4,5,6 and 7 will be on channel ONE. Officers assigned to Zone 8 will monitor channel Two, officers assigned to Zone 9 will monitor channel Five, officers assigned to Zone 10 will monitor channel Three and officers assigned to Zone 11 will monitor channel Six.
- 10. All officers assigned to the Zone prisoner transport wagons will report to 1 Schroeder Plaza, in the Media Room for an 8:30 PM briefing.
- 11. All officers will remain on post until relieved. Only the Incident Commander has the authority to release any officers assigned to the World Series Event.
